INTRODUCTION

Your child has been placed on probation by order of the Summit County Juvenile Court and he or she is required to comply with the rules of probation. The assigned Probation Office will identify the rules of probation and develop an individualized supervision plan. The Probation Officer will also monitor compliance with these rules by contacting you, your child, counseling agencies, school and other service providers. The Probation Officer will assess your child's case periodically to determine if he or she has complied with the established guidelines. As a parent or guardian, you will be asked to participate in the case plan which has as its goal your child's successful completion of probation and a crime-free lifestyle. Your child's termination from Court supervision is determined by his or her ability to meet the conditions of the Court. Any violations of these conditions may result in a return to Court.

RULES OF PROBATION

1. Your child shall obey all local, county, state and federal laws and ordinances and shall notify his or her Probation Officer if arrested, detained or questioned by law enforcement.
2. Your child shall attend school as required, comply with school rules and report any suspensions or expulsions to you and his or her Probation Officer.
3. Your child should not leave home at any hour of the day or night without your specific consent. You are to have full knowledge of your child's whereabouts at all times, as well as the expected hour of return. Curfew will be set by the Probation Officer and parent/guardian.

4. Your child shall report any change of address or phone number to his or her Probation Officer immediately.
5. Your child shall not use, buy, sell or hold any alcohol, drugs or tobacco. Your child shall submit to drug/alcohol testing at the request of the Probation Officer. Your child is prohibited from possessing, carrying or using a firearm or weapon of any kind.
6. You and your child shall cooperate with counseling ordered by the Court.
7. Your child shall maintain regular contact with his or her Probation Officer.
8. Your child's probation is scheduled to be terminated on _____ or when all court orders have been successfully completed.
9. Your child shall follow the direct instructions of his or her Probation Officer and these special conditions:

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Please know that a probation violation on a felony case or another felony offense committed by your child could result in his or her commitment to a Department of Youth Services facility. As parent or guardian, the Probation Dept. expects you to continue to exert parental control over your child's behavior. That includes informing the Probation Dept. of any illegal activities or probation violations. Failure to do so could subject you to Ohio Revised Code Sections 2152.19, F(1) and F(2). Probation Officers are authorized to conduct searches without a warrant at your place of residence, family vehicles, possessions or property. A Probation Officer will schedule an interview with your child and you within ten (10) working days.

The Probation Officer will define additional responsibilities for your child and you. Your child will have the following responsibilities:
