FY 2008 Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) Program	Ohio Emergency Management- Federal Department of Homeland Security	This Grant <b>2006-07</b> has assisted in funding Medical Reserve Corp Coordinator, Medical Medical Response System Specialist, Domestic Preparedness Task Force Strategic Planning Retreat, National Incident Management System training, Public Education on Pandemic Flu and Communications Equipment.
Security Program (SHSP), County	Agency- Federal Homeland Security	This grant is used for Decontamination, first responders pharmaceuticals, first responders personnel protective equipment, monitors, translation devices, generator, portable x-ray and communications equipment.

FY 2008 Emergency Management Performance Grant	Ohio Emergency Management Agency-Federal Homeland Security-FEMA	This Grant program is for local Emergency Management Programs. Under this program capabilities for Mitigation, Preparedness, Response and Recovery of a disaster should be enhanced.
